MESSAGE TO ST. JAMES PARISHIONERS

Marty and I are in the middle of our relocation to North Carolina. Soon we will be leaving the people of St James and finding a new church home in Brevard. We will sorely miss being with you and we are very hopeful that many of you will make your way up to visit us.

St James has been an important part of my life these past few years. It was where Marty and I were married and it has helped sustain me to face the challenges of my illness. For Marty, it has been her spiritual base since her childhood. Her parents called St. James home and you joined with her in nurturing John Alex who now is rector of a church in Mississippi.

My belief in God is that he is not only among us; he is also in each of us. Truly God is Love and that "God is Love" is what Jesus wanted us to internalize. Indeed, Jesus so perfectly internalized "God is Love" until it permeated every cell of his earthly body and he became God. While we will never attain that level of perfection, we are to be vigilant in our efforts to nurture and maximum that "God is Love" approach to our time on earth. When Jesus told us that when we ministered to the poor and needy, we were ministering to Him, I think he was being literal. The poor and needy, like us, have God within them. Our efforts for them are efforts for God in them. When we accept that God is a part of each of us, then concepts of racial prejudice, gender bias, and the like clearly have no legitimacy. In the same light when we recognize that God is a part of each of us, then no challenge is beyond our reach.

To me, the role of a church is to discover where God resides in each of its members and through education, nurture, and exercise to maximize the "God is Love" that resides in each other. The people of St James epitomize that philosophy. We encourage each other. We complement each other. We lift each other up. In the process the "God is Love" part of our being expands and grows stronger. That growth, unless allowed to whither and atrophy, will remain with us forever.

In that sense, St James will always be a part of us and we will always be a part of St James. You have made us more aware of the "God is Love" that resides in us and I like to believe that we somehow have made each of you more aware of and in touch with the "God is Love" which resides in you. May God Bless each of you.

The Men's Health Day was held at the Southern Hills Recreational Center and wasorganized by LSUS Feist-Weiller and Louisiana Cancer Control Partner-

ship. It focused health issues that affect the men of our community, such as, prostate cancer, diabetes, hypertension, and elevated cholesterol. St. Luke's played a part by offering diabetes screenings. We saw over 75 men and made several onward referrals for follow-up care.

There are many ways to volunteer with St. Luke's. Kathy is a great example of how you can contribute to this ministry by sharing your talents and skills.

St. Luke's Medical Ministry went extremely well at the Men's Health Day at Southern Hills, November 17th. The additional volunteers freed Brenda, Ron, and Lois to concentrate on sticking each client's finger for a blood glucose test. Jimmy got the medical van properly placed and set up, then we were ready for people. Each person had a page with a list of different stations to visit. Brody got them started by filling in "blood sugar" next to St. Luke's Medical on their sheet, and I added a sticker indicating they had been at our station. Inside the van, Matt, a college student volunteer, took down their name and other information. Ron, Lois, or Brenda would do the blood glucose test and put the results on Matt's information sheet. Rory would then put all the client information in Brenda's program on her computer. Things went so smoothly that I was able to get a few good pictures.

Thanks, again, everyone for helping us with the breakfast schedule. I hope you can sign up soon.





On behalf of all of us here at the Jersey Shore, I wanted to send our thanks to you for your donation of \$600 in gift cards to local Hurricane Sandy relief efforts. The kindness and care that you have shown through your gift is a wonderful example to all.

I wanted to share just a few examples of those that have benefitted from your generosity:


- A school for disabled children with many families displaced. It is difficult enough to lose your possessions and your home, but having to do that with a severely disabled child can bring extra stress to a family.
- A firehouse in Oceanport that was turned into a temporary shelter.
- A firehouse in Port Monmouth that acted as a clearinghouse for severely affected communities in their area.
- Many individual families with children that were displaced. What a terrible site it is to see all of a family's belongings in a pile in the front yard. We had volunteers simply driving through towns that were devastated and handing out gift cards to people cleaning out all of their possessions.
- Purchase of moving supplies (boxes, tape, bubblewrap) to help people pack up items that were able to be saved.
- Purchase of a small non-electric heater for a family that cannot afford to relocate but has been without power since the storm.
- A hospice organization to help those affected by the storm that are also caring for a loved one in the final weeks and months of their lives.

The list could go on and on of those that have been helped by your kind gift. We thank you for partnering with us and trusting in our ability to reach out to those so severely affected by Hurricane Sandy. We have been honored to be able to pass your gift on to our grateful community members?

VAYA CON DIOS, SARAH!

St. James will certainly miss one of our most faithful members when Sarah Roberts Salmela moves to Boise, Idaho to live with her daughter, Debra. Sarah has attended St. James since becoming a member in June of 1976. Both her daughters were confirmed at St. James; Lisa in 1977 and Debra in 1978. Both daughters held their weddings at St. James: Lisa in 1993 and Debra in 1995, so St. James has definitely been a family affair for Sarah.

Sarah has not only been a faithful parishioner of St. James but has also served in many different capacities during her 37 years. She has served on the vestry twice, when Dan Krutz was rector and again when Rocki Proffitt was rector. She served as director of the Altar Guild for 25 years, and many Sundays we see Sarah serving at the altar as Eucharistic minister. In addition, Sarah has been on numerous committees at St. James including search committees for rector and discernment committees for the deaconship. She is a member of the Daughters of the King and has served as a leader in the DOC.

Sarah was the first person in the diocese to complete the lengthy Education for Ministry study and went on to be the first person from St. James to serve on the Executive Diocese Committee.
