



# A MESSAGE FROM MORGAN

Dear Family of St. James,

This past week we held our sixth annual Legacy Luncheon here at St. James. The intent of this gathering was to give us all a chance to pay homage to the older generations that have gone before us and that are still in our midst who have laid the foundation of faith we as a congregation stand upon. I have always been impressed and intrigued by St. James because we are still a relatively young parish. What I mean by this is that some of our current members had a hand in shaping this congregation from the very beginning and they are still here and willing to share their stories with us. Our history is rich and Roger and Molly Wilkinson did an excellent job on Wednesday of conveying the important role St. James has played in their lives.

Legacy Luncheon always gets me thinking about the older and wiser people in my life who have shaped my faith and given



me an appreciation for and a better understanding of what it means to belong to a Christian community. The truth is that there are so many, I could fill this entire newsletter with stories. I have been truly blessed with great spiritual guidance and encouragement throughout my life, but today I will limit my story telling to one person - my grandmother. Most of you see her at 11 o'clock on Sunday morning. She and my mom sit towards the front on the Gospel side. She is faithful in attendance, but what you might not know about her is that she has a very strong personal prayer life. As far back as I can remember, she has gotten in bed 30-45 minutes early every single night to pray. Talking to God is just part of her daily routine - it's like breathing. She is one of the only people I know that has pretty much memorized the Book of Common Prayer. In fact, she was telling me the other day that while in the hospital she has still been able to keep up her nightly regime of prayer even without her book. She has been saying those prayers for so long, the words have soaked into her skin. Her days and nights are shaped and formed with those words in the back of her mind. What a great way to live! She has always encouraged her family to take their faith seriously and I think it is because of her that most all of us (and believe me there are lots - 3 children, 8 grandchildren and 11 greats - with three more on the way) are still very connected and involved in the life of the Church. I hope to be able to instill in my children and grandchildren the joy of worshipping and learning about Christ that she has instilled in me.

Who are the older and wiser people in your lives that have shaped your faith and understanding of Christian community? Take some time this week or next to tell them how much their encouragement and support has meant to you. Let's honor those in our lives who have given and continue to provide us with a strong foundation on which to build our faith.

Another batch of Goodwill vouchers were recently delivered to the Project ING/I2D for distribution to those they serve, as a result of the bags deposited in the Parish Hall.



We have plans for a Back Pack/School Supply drive scheduled for August. We can all begin purchasing standard school supplies now on our trips to stores that have them. This is going to be a really big outreach program by St James.

Eighteen new niches for the columbarium have been approved for purchase. They are being pre-sold now and are \$850/each. If you were at the adult forum that discussed funerals and expenses, you know that the St James columbarium is a real bargain! Purchase your niche now by phoning the office.

A suggestion was to remove ½ of a pew on each side of the church so a wheelchair or walker could easily fit and the person using this device would have a place for family to join them for the service. If you have an opinion about this idea, please discuss this matter with a Vestry member as we will be discussing this at our June meeting and working on a plan. If there are any other projects you would like to see addressed about the physical plant, please let one of the Vestry members know. We always appreciate input from the congregation. Thanks.

## WHILE THE CAT'S AWAY THE MICE WILL PLAY



#### T COMES IN ALL found a t-shirt the other day while sorting through boxes that hadn't been opened since a move a few years back. It was one of my favorites for many years. I purchased it at a fund-raiser for what was, in the mid-1980's, a brand new student organization on the campus of the University of Illinois: Inter-racial. Their purpose was to provide support to inter-racial couples, "because people aren't color coded." Their goal was to educate the community so that the organization would no longer need to exist—so people would realize that people are people and race is an artificial barrier. And that reminded me of an experience I'd had in the mid-seventies when I was traveling with a sixty-voice choir, The Family of God. We had performed at a church in Georgia where we'd had a regular annual gig. However, after this particular performance we were advised that we were not welcome to ever return. At the time I thought it was because they were offended by our take on a song, I am a Promise, in which we removed our red choir robes to reveal black (almost knee-length) shorts, black vest, white shirt, and white bow tie, before picking up our silver top hats and black canes and performing a chorus line kick. Decades later I wonder if the real kicker had been a different number, one in which we went into the audience and passed out colorful balloons while singing, Love, It Comes in all Colors. Here are a few of the words: Love, it comes in all colors. You can accept it, or you can be blind. Good, it comes in all colors. When you accept it more love you will find. Love inside a person isn't strong or weak through color. Attitude and spirit are what make you real. What you look like on the outside doesn't really matter. If you know the Son of God, it's how you feel. I just have to wonder, was it the rather tame chorus line with the inspirational words that offended? I can go anywhere that He wants me to go. I can be anything that he wants me to be. I can climb the high mountains. I can cross the wide sea. I am a great big promise, you see. I am a promise to be anything God wants me to be. Or was it the song about the foolishness of racial prejudice that offended? Or maybe the combination of the two? To my knowledge we were never given a specific reason. But I am glad that I grew up among people who didn't find either offensive. And I am pleased to be a part of a church that is very adamant and sincere in welcoming everyone to the body of Christ. Thank goodness St James, as a part of the Episcopal Church, welcomes us all. -Jnanne Zepeda
