



A MESSAGE FROMTHE SENIOR WARDEN

Hello St. James Family,

I have been talking with Canon John Bedingfield from the

Bishop's office about scheduling dates for him to come up to St. James so you can have an opportunity to speak to him about your hopes and concerns for this parish. We are starting out with three dates, and if the demand is high, we will add additional dates.

The three dates that Canon John will be in Shreveport will be:

Saturday, June 16, Tuesday, June 19, and

Thursday, June 28.

The meetings will start at 10 am, and the appointments will be in 30 minute blocks going from 10 am until 1:30 pm. Canon John will have an hour lunch from 1:30 pm until 2:30 pm. He then will resume meeting with us from 2:30 pm until 8 pm.

You do not have to use all 30 minutes, but please be mindful of the time, as there will be people waiting behind you, and if you go over the 30 minutes, it will delay all the meetings after yours.

If you are retired, or otherwise can rearrange your schedule to meet with Canon John on either Tuesday, June 19, or Wednesday, June 28, please do so, so that the people who cannot get time off from work during the week can sign up for the slots on Saturday, June 16.

Please call Jnanne in the church office at 686-1261 to sign up. Finally, please sign up sooner rather than later, because if we need to add more dates, we need to find that out as soon as possible.


Outreach News

Check out the Angel Tree in the Narthex. Tags currently on the tree reflect those items we need to stuff into backpacks for Forest Hill Elementary School by the end of July. Our goal is to completely fill five packs per grade (for a total of thirty backpacks) with all the items on the school supply list for the academic year 2018-19. We also plan to provide many of the items requested for the special education classrooms—which are additional items a child who may happen to be in those classes will need. Those items will be presented to the Special Ed teachers in a box for distribution as needed, since we have no way of knowing which individual backpacks would require any of those items. Please, pull tags from the tree, buy the items listed on the tags, and deposit them on the table in the Parish Hall next to the Outreach donation bins. We need all items to be here by July 15 so Outreach has time to inventory and obtain anything that is missing. We plan to fill the backpacks after the luncheon on St. James Day, July 29, so they will be ready and at the school before classes begin.

No need to buy backpacks. Outreach has already purchased packs with the name of the school printed on them, so each child will receive an identical one.

Anyone who wishes to make monetary donations to Outreach to help fund the purchase of those supplies still needing to be picked up (after donations are in the Parish Hall) are encouraged to do so. Just leave your contribution in the offering plate with a note designating it for the Backpack Program or drop your donation by the parish office during business hours. Thanks in advance to everyone who helps with this vital ministry. Let us do our part to help the children in Southern Hills stay competitive in the classroom!


These are some of the ways that St. James makes use of the time and talents of our parishioners as we strive to be good stewards toward each other and our community.



CURRENT FINANCIAL STATUS OF ST. JAMES

Every year as summer begins the number of people attending services dwindles. Parishioners take vacations, visit family and friends, and fill their weekends with activities that make it more difficult to attend every week. And while some have made their pledging easy on themselves by having checks sent directly from their banks to St. James, others prefer to place their contributions directly into the Sunday offering basket when they are present. Here is where we stand regarding our present income:

For those who wish to track their donations to St. James, mid-year contribution statements are available in the Narthex. We do not mail mid-year statements, as they are not bills and are not suitable documents for taxes. We make statements available again around the beginning of December for those who wish to track their giving. At the end of the calendar year we print Contribution Statements that are suitable for use when filing taxes. These are placed in the Narthex until the Annual Meeting. Any still here after the Annual Meeting are mailed out.

We are hoping that as the summer progresses more folk will remember how much fun they had and find the time to join us for an evening of food, fellowship, and fun. Dear Friends,

The Diocesan Convention for 2018 will be an abbreviated, one-day meeting. You will receive more detailed information about Convention under separate cover, but for now please note that the date of Convention 2018 is Saturday, November 3. We will gather in Pineville at Country Inn and Suites. Quite early that day we will celebrate a simple said Eucharist at Mount Olivet, anticipating a smaller-than-usual attendance.

The reason for an abbreviated meeting is that, starting in 2019, Diocesan Convention will occur each year on the first Friday and Saturday of Lent. There are several reasons for this, but the most important is that it will positively affect congregations' ability to determine their pledge to the Diocese on the basis of a completed annual fund process in the preceding autumn. Additionally, we will avoid conflicts with football and Mardi Gras celebrations. Alas, no date will avoid all conflicts or fail to impose inconvenience on someone. This is the best imperfect date we could find.

As usual, this summer you will receive notice of elections to be held in November. You will also receive notice that 2019 congregational pledges to the Diocese will be due in early January. The Diocesan Council will vote on a provisional budget to continue Diocesan operations until the Convention votes.

With the 2019 Convention our schedule will return to two days and will once again include a festive Eucharist. Our plan is to hold the 2019 Convention in Alexandria.

First Camp

for campers going into grades 2 and 3 with their parents First Camp is for campers going on to grades 2 and 3, along with their parents. This two night session introduces campers and their parent or guardian to a taste of sammer camping life at Hardmer. Campers stay in cabins with their counselors and cabin mates and begin creating bonds that can last a lifetime. Parents also stay in cabins separate from their little campers, but are encouraged to participate fully in the daily activities. June 1-3, \$200

Senior High Camp for campers going into grades 11, 12, or graduating this spring. This seven - night session takes everything we do at camp and rolls it into one action packed week. These campers continue to learn leadership, friendship, responsibil-

ity, and the love of God during this session. The cost is \$675 per camper and includes registration, meals, canteen, milk and cookies, camp t-shirt, and camp picture.

June 7-14, \$675

Summer Camp Registration is now underway!

Primary Camp

for campers going into grades 4, 5, and 6. This five-night session is a high energy sprint from start to finish. Campers experience new ways to worship, experience community living and cabin life, and build friendships, all wrapped up in games, activities, and songs. The cost is \$475 per camper and includes registration, meals, canteen, milk and cookies, camp t-shirt, and camp picture.

June 18-23, \$475

Junior High Camp

for campers going into grades 6, 7, and 8

This six-night session expands the Primary Camp model by offering more age appropriate activities, exploration of spirituality, and all the fun of summer camp. The cost for this camp session is \$575 per camper and includes registration, meals, canteen, milk and cookies, camp t-shirt, and camp picture.

June 27-July 3, \$575

Middle High Camp for campers going into grades 9, 10, and 11

Middle High Camp is for campers going in to grades 9, 10, and 11. This six night session is full of traditional camp fun, while focusing on the development of our present and future church leaders. We consider it a great privilege to work with these campers on relationship building, peer issues, and leadership qualities that will carry the Episcopal Church forward in the 21st century.

July 9-15, \$575

Camp Able

for individuals ages 9 and up with special needs

Camp Able is specifically designed for persons with special needs. It is not about disabilities, but rather about abilities! Christ has called us to love God and to love our neighbor as He has loved us – without conditions or limits – it is in celebration of that perfect love that we come together at Camp Able.

We need to continue to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, house the homeless, and bring the light of Christ into the darkness...and we can't do that by focusing on ourselves.

We are flawed like all of humankind, and as such are in a position to understand the flaws and needs of others. By accepting that truth we are able to work toward making the world in which we live a better place for us and for those around us.

As Paul told the Corinthians, we need to rely on faith, hope, and love. We need to practice faith, hope, and love. We need to demonstrate faith, hope, and love. We are capable of these things. Let us put them into practice for the long haul—and as we do so, let us not forget that we are members of the Episcopal Church, and as such we welcome all who wish to join us.
