

There will be a Celebration of Women's Ministries held at Camp Hardtner on September 20–21, 2019. This is a time for numerous diverse ministries to come together and celebrate in the name of our Lord and Savior. The ministries of the Diocesan Daughters of the King, Episcopal Church Women, and Altar Guild women will hold meetings; and our guest speaker, Mother Betty Jo Kauffman, Archdeacon of the Diocese and Deacon at Christ Episcopal Church, (Bastrop) will share some of her photographs, while talking about "how and why interacting with creation [S a spiritual practice".
