



Outreach News

Thank-you to those who are getting an early start on the 2019 Backpack Program. We have two and one half bins of school supplies already gathered and stored in the Parish Hall Outreach area! To date we have several binders, a couple of pencil pouches, many pair of scissors, pencils, glue, highlighters, pink erasers, and pencil-top erasers. By now many of us have a good idea of what are the basic items always on the supply list for students: 24-packs Crayola crayons, #2 lead pencils, wide-rule notebook paper, composition notebooks, etc. As you see them on clearance at phenomenally low



prices, please go ahead and pick them up. They can be stored in the Outreach Bins located in the Parish Hall. Before we make up the tags for the Angel Tree next year we will inventory what has already been donated.

Please note that the Gift of Warmth boxes are located in the Parish Hall to collect warm blankets, coats, hats, gloves, scarves, etc. for delivery to Hope House and Providence House for distribution to those in need. Please donate new or gently used items before Thanksgiving.

STEWARDSHIP DRIVE UPDATE

As of this printing St. James has received eleven commitment cards pledging \$72,090.00 toward the general fund in 2019. Money in the general fund goes toward Outreach, ministries, salaries, and everyday expenses such as utilities and supplies. Some parishioners choose to pledge a little extra each month, designating those additional funds be placed in the Building

Fund which is used only building projects, maintenance, and upkeep of the buildings and grounds.

Last year we received 34 pledge cards totaling \$129,090.00.

The 2018 budget anticipated \$195,794.64 in expenses, so we have a little ways to go to be certain we can pay all the 2019 bills...Please get those commitment cards turned in before All Saints' Day on November 4 so the Budget Committee can have accurate numbers when they meet.






















The following All Saints devotion is taken from the Forward Day By Day issue which begins November 1, 2018.

At times I have pictured the saints like superheroes. They may not have invisible jets or capes like Wonder Woman or Superman, but for me, Saints are incredible and exotic. Occasionally I see glimpses of truth, like on a cold, wet, January day in 2014, when I gathered with several hundred people to honor the martyrdom of a saint.

Following prayers, the crowd venerated the relics of a saint. I saw a speck of bone encased in gold and a pair of gloves worn by the martyr on the day he died. Both seemed small and vulnerable—very much human, very much like me. I reached into my coat pocket to touch my own gloves.

In that tender and tactile moment, I realized how very human are the saints of the Church and how their human-


LOYALTY SUNDAY



THE EPISCOPAL CHURCH WELCOMES YOU

There are several things I "like best" about the Episcopal Church. Prominent on that list is the fact we don't require that all members swallow the pie whole. We allow individuals to think and reason and come up with their own conclusions regarding many aspects of the Church. We don't kick people out if they aren't perfect or if they don't agree with the majority. The thing on the very top of my list is the fact the Episcopal Church welcomes all people.

When I was a teenager I attended a very fundamentalist church that had a different view of welcoming all. They welcomed all who were pretty much like them. They went so far as to disinvite individuals whom they felt did not live up to their standards. For example, they took away leadership roles from divorced individuals who remarried, pointing to the Bible verse that indicates an elder of the church should be "a man of one wife." And, using that same verse they still don't allow women to lead anything other than the choir or a children's Sunday School class. When I discovered the Episcopal Church I found it refreshing to be introduced to a body of Christ that expends effort telling people why they are good enough to come to a worship service, rather than listing all the reasons why they are not.

I still find it amazing that anyone feels they are superior enough to deny another individual or a group of people access to God. It seems to me that if we are truly concerned about what we view as deficiencies in the other person, all the more reason to invite them into our church! If the Church isn't a place for sinners, we'll have some mighty empty buildings around the country.

We don't have a hierarchy of sins, with a list of those that are too heinous for forgiveness. And we don't believe we have the ability to look into the hearts of our fellow worshipers to discern worthiness. We don't necessarily know who is troubled or who is contemplating making a phenomenally bad decision. What we do know is that if a person needs assistance, we are willing to do our best to help out. One thing we know for certain is that none of us is perfect, yet we are each accepted, flaws and all.

We extend that same welcome to any and all who enter the church, because the Episcopal Church welcomes you and me and everyone else. The Episcopal Church is not an exclusive club, but an inclusive body of Christ.

Now isn't that wonderful? The Episcopal Church welcomes you!!!




